

Famous Dancers Instruct at Vt. College, Where Miss Diamond Was Summer Student

Studying modern dancing under the direction of leading professional dancers of the country occupied the greater part of the activities of Miss Ruth Diamond, physical education instructor, during the summer.

Miss Diamond attended Bennington College, Bennington, Vermont, for a six weeks' course in the art of modern dancing. This college, an exclusive girls' school, is a well-known institution of experimentation in the modern methods of teaching.
